

That is the aim of this new work rising up in South Kansas City. In its current stage, they meet on Sunday mornings in their home for fellowship gatherings. In View of the Promise Land By Dallas Elder

Thomas Omenta of Kenya came to our GCI Conference and shared this story. "A man plants a mango tree. He digs the ground, plants the seed, waters and cares for it. Slowly the tree begins to grow. It takes considerable time to grow. He may not live long enough to enjoy its shade or eat of its fruit. However, his faithfulness provides shade and fruit for those who come after him." People he may never know, will benefit from his faithful work. The Kingdom of God is a continuum. It flows from one generation to the next. We faithfully build the foundation or do our part to plant and cultivate in our season. Others come after us and benefit from our faithfulness.

"Then the Lord said to him (Moses), "This is the land I promised on oath to Abraham, Isaac and Jacob when I said, "I will give it to your descendants." I have let you see it with your eyes, but you will not cross over into it." ... Moses was a hundred and twenty years old when he died, yet his eyes were not weak nor his strength gone." (Dt 34:4, 7) Moses was an amazing leader. The Lord knew him "face to face." God used him to do incredible signs and wonders to lead Israel out of captivity in Egypt. He has his own place in biblical history. "For no one has ever shown the mighty power or performed the awesome deeds that Moses did in the sight of Israel." (Dt **34:12)** God sovereignly chose Israel, powerfully delivered them from captivity and offered them the Promise Land. They rebelled and refused to enter it and possess the land. It was their lack of faith. The consequence was to wander in the wilderness for 40 years and then expire. Moses and Aaron forfeited their opportunity as well. "Because you both broke faith with me in the presence of the Israelites at the waters of Meribah Kadesh in the Desert of Zin and because you did not uphold my holiness among the Israelites. Therefore, you will see the land from a distance; you will not enter the land I am giving to the people of Israel." (Dt 32:51-52) It seemed like a small thing. Israel was thirsty for water. God told Moses and Aaron to speak to the rock (Numbers 20). But instead, they hit the rock with their staff. Water gushed from the rock. That was what they did the time before. This time God told them to speak to the rock. God said, "You didn't do what I said. You broke faith. You didn't reverence Me before the people." Continued >>>

The result was, Moses didn't get to enter the Promise Land and could only view it from afar. Our choices have consequences. As leaders, trusting God and honoring Him before His people is essential to lead them into the Promise Land. And, for us to possess it for ourselves. The Scripture has numerous references pointing to the Moses Generation and saying "Learn from their mistakes." Sometimes, people have put all of the emphasis on the Joshua Generation. They possessed the Promise Land. Remember it was God's intention that the Moses Generation would position the Joshua Generation, and both prosper in the Promise Land. God has His standards for His People and even higher standards for His Leaders. "You know that we who teach will be judged more strictly." (JS 3:1) Leaders don't always get it right. Know this fact: Moses received the Covenant of the Law from the Lord that became the righteous foundation of Israel in the Promise Land and for successive generations. Millions of people have sat under the shade of that tree and eaten of its fruit including the Church of Jesus Christ.

Fast forward to the New Testament. Take a look at what the Apostle Peter says. "But you are a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's special possession, that you may declare the praises of him who called you out of darkness into his wonderful light. Once you were not a people, but now you are the people of God; once you had not received mercy, but now you have received mercy." (I Peter 2:9-10) Peter points back to the reference of Israel and its preliminary Kingdom significance. He underscores the NT Church, the Kingdom of Christ. Jesus brought us the Covenant of Grace!

I'm an old church planter. I've witnessed the Lord gathering a group of people together, a flock to follow Christ. I've labored to pray, corral, pastor and lead those sheep. I've driven the enemy away who came to scatter and devour the flock. With God's help, I fed the flock, led the flock and cared for the flock. Through His faithfulness, I've seen with my own eyes, "People who were not a people, become the people of God." They became a loving, supportive family in Christ Jesus. They became committed to Jesus and each other. It was an incredible work of God!

of gathering a group of pastors, missionaries and ministry leaders into Grace Covenant International.
